

THIS WEEK'S MISSIONS FOCUS: ACROSS THE WORLD

Operation Christmas Child (OCC)

Operation Christmas Child, a project of Samaritan's Purse, collects and delivers gift-filled shoeboxes to children in over 170 countries, aiming to share the message of Jesus Christ and bring joy to children who might not otherwise receive gifts. Individuals, families, and churches pack the shoeboxes with school supplies, toys, and hygiene items and then drop them off at designated locations during National Collection Week.

Worldwide Distribution

Before shoeboxes arrive in the designated countries, volunteer National Leadership Teams train pastors and community leaders who learn how to host child-friendly outreach events, and how to implement *The Greatest Journey*, a 12-week follow-up discipleship program.

Outreach Events

Pastors around the world host shoebox distributions in places where people may not know Christ and invite them to follow Him. Other churches use the boxes as resources for outreach in orphanages and other at-risk areas. In many places, children also receive *The Greatest Gift*, a gospel story booklet Samaritan's Purse developed for shoebox recipients.

Discipleship and Multiplication

As a result of what they learn in *The Greatest Journey*, boys and girls grow in Christ and share with friends and family. At graduation, the gospel is shared, and many parents, siblings, and friends accept Christ and become active members in local churches. Families are reached, churches grow, new churches are started, and communities are transformed.
