

School Time Bible Ministries (STBM)

Reaching Students and their Families with the Life-Changing Word of God

School Time Bible Ministries (STBM) partners with parents, public schools, churches, and ministry groups to offer off-campus biblical education for public school students. The School Time Bible (STB) curriculum, *God's Plan of Redemption*, follows God's plan from Genesis to Revelation and helps students understand the gospel, grow in the Christian faith, and apply biblical principles to daily life.

Founded in 1914 in Gary, Indiana, as a non-profit, STBM has provided classes at off-campus sites for over a century. Since expanding to South Carolina in 1996, the program now serves over 10,000 students from more than 100 public schools. For over 20 years, SAPC has hosted the local program for CrossRoads Intermediate School (CRIS) in Lexington-Richland School District Five.

YOU CAN HELP

Whether you have teaching experience or simply a heart to serve, your involvement can make a meaningful difference in the lives of local students. Volunteer opportunities are available for:

- **Teachers**—prepare and deliver lessons to 6th graders.
- Classroom Helpers—assist with activities and provide support and help distribute lunch meals
- Safety Workers—ensure students cross St. Andrews Rd. and the railroad track safely.
- Prayer Warriors—offer spiritual support for students and staff.

The next program begins on January 6, 2026, and follows the 9-week school schedule. Classes are held in the Youth Area on Tuesdays and Thursdays during the students' lunch hour. The time commitment for volunteers is approximately 3 hours on Tuesday or Thursday. Specific details will be clearer as the start of the second semester approaches. *Curious?
