

#### THIS WEEK'S MISSIONS FOCUS: ACROSS THE COUNTRY

## Mission to the World (MTW): Michael and Lindie Wadhams Native American Ministry: Washington, Montana and Arizona

In July 1998, Michael Wadhams and family moved from Cape Town, South Africa, to the U.S. to work with Native Americans. They entered a full-time pulpit ministry on the Cherokee Indian reservation in North Carolina. After several years serving the Lummi and Nooksack Tribes in Washington state, the Wadhams relocated to Apache Junction, where they now serve Native Americans in in the Southwest (SW) while continuing their efforts in the Pacific Northwest (PNW). They work among the tribes through developing relations, evangelism, and mentoring/discipleship. The long-term goal is to establish Native churches in each region.

## **Highlights from Michael's Summer and Fall Newsletters**

My oversight has expanded to include Native discipleship and pastoral training between the PNW and the SW regions, as well as maintaining my relationship with Dontrell in Blackfeet, Montana. More so, helping churches of the SW develop crosscultural work and develop native Christian leaders to lead crosstribal outreach between the PNW and SW. We are, indeed, seeing the Lord build bridges ... with rich relationships from Cherokee to Lummi and Nooksack and now into Tohono O'odham. We are thrilled to share how the Lord is working, and how He will connect all the tribes we've worked with together in a chorus of missional work to native America.

SAPC has been involved in this exciting ministry among Native Americans through mission journeys to both the Lummi-Nooksack and Tohono O'odham Tribes. On these trips, participants have engaged in community-building projects, cultural activities, and supportive initiatives identified by tribal leaders. Pray for those who will be taking another trip to work with the Tohono O'odham next March.
