





THIS WEEK'S MISSIONS FOCUS: ACROSS THE WORLD

Water Mission

Headquartered in Charleston, SC

In 1998, Water Mission's founders, Molly & George Greene, were operating an environmental engineering company. When Hurricane Mitch left devastation in its wake in Honduras in 1998, the Greenes received multiple requests for water treatment systems...but they couldn't find workable existing systems. So George and his team of engineers built such a system—and Water Mission International was born. This nonprofit Christian engineering ministry provides sustainable, safe water solutions to people in developing countries and to those impacted by disasters.

A Water Impact Story, edited from their November newsletter

The Christmas season is one of joy and peace. But for Matrida, joy always felt far away when the water she drank posed a risk to her health and the health of her unborn baby. Matrida and her husband Robert were preparing to welcome their first child. They lived in Chimwenje, Malawi, far from any water source. Matrida spent hours each day walking to collect water that was unsafe. Walking far in the African heat while carrying a heavy bucket of water is a challenging task for anyone, but it was especially grueling while eight months pregnant.

Despite her circumstances, Matrida clung to God throughout her pregnancy. Shortly before becoming pregnant, she had committed her life to serving Jesus. Matrida had joy on the horizon—not only was she about to be a mother, but she would also be able to raise her baby with access to safe, clean water. In the fall of 2023, Water Mission began building a safe water project in Chimwenje, in partnership with Compassion International and the local residents. "This will be my first baby. I'm so very excited and happy. I'll wash him, wash his clothes, cook for him, and give him food and water that is safe because the water project will be close to home."
